Aurora, Nebraska March 9, 2021

All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Said funds are to be used for the RYDE Transit transportation operations in Fiscal Year 2021-2022 Application for Public Transportation Assistance.

RESOLUTION NO. 21-03

WHEREAS, the Aurora Planning Commission and the Aurora City Council have held public hearings to receive public input regarding the preliminary plat and the final plat of Willis Subdivision, a Part of Lot 4, Residency Estates Subdivision Replat 2, an Addition to the City of Aurora, Hamilton County, Nebraska, said area containing approximately 1.308 acres more or less; and have held separate public hearings to consider whether the Subdivision should be included within the Corporate limits of the City of Aurora, and

WHEREAS, said plat of Willis Subdivision meets the requirements of the Subdivision Regulations of the City of Aurora, and the Statutes of the State of Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the Aurora Planning Commission has recommended to the City Council approval of the final plat to be known as Willis Subdivision and has recommended that it be included within the corporate limits, and the City Council on this date has voted for approval of this Subdivision; and has voted to include this Subdivision within the City Limits.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Aurora, Nebraska, that the final plat of Willis Subdivision be hereby approved and that said addition shall be included within the Corporate limits of the City of Aurora, Nebraska, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to execute the approval of said plat, and cause the same to be filed as required by law.

Councilor Phillips moved to bring Ordinance No. 1118 before the council and to approve the first reading of this ordinance. Councilor Roblee seconded the motion. Voting Aye: Dunn, Phillips, Lohrmeyer, Lackore, Roblee and Bartling. None. The motion carried.
