A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Aurora, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session at 7:30 p.m. on August 23, 2022 at the City Hall. City Officials present were City Administrator Eric Melcher, City Attorney Ross Luzum, Chief of Police Paul Graham, Utilities Superintendent Adam Darbro and Clerk/Treasurer Barbra Mikkelsen.

Notice of meeting was simultaneously given to the Mayor and all members of the Council and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to these minutes. Availability of the agenda of this meeting was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the Mayor and Council. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Mayor Seeman opened the duly advertised public hearing to receive public comments regarding an application to the Nebraska Department of Economic Development for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). This grant is available to local governments for community/economic development activities. The City of Aurora is requesting \$435,000.00 for Downtown Revitalization Project. The Mayor asked if there was anyone present who wished to speak in support of the application. Lori Ferguson, Community Consultant with South Central Economic Development District, Inc. spoke in favor of the application. Kelsey Bergen with Aurora Development Corporation and Justise Rhoden, Aurora Chamber of Commerce also spoke in favor of the application. The Mayor then asked if there was anyone present who wished to speak in opposition to the proposed recommendation and there was no one. There being no one else present to speak in favor of or opposition to the proposed recommendation the Mayor declared the public hearing closed.
