Mayor Seeman opened the duly advertised public hearing to receive public comments regarding the Preliminary Plat of Mission Critical Subdivision, a tract of land comprising a part of the Northwest Quarter (NW¼), Section Fifteen (15), Township Ten (10) North, Range Six (6) West of the 6th P.M., Hamilton County, Nebraska.

The Mayor asked if there was anyone present who wished to speak in regards to the proposed recommendation. Kelsey Bergen, Executive Director, Aurora Development Corporation (ADC) explained the project. Zoning Administrator Darbro stated the Planning Commission recommended approval. Mayor Seeman opened the duly advertised public hearing to receive public comments regarding the Final Plat of the Mission Critical First Addition, a tract of land comprising a part of the Northwest Quarter (NW¼), Section Fifteen (15), Township Ten (10) North, Range Six (6) West of the 6th P.M., Hamilton County, Nebraska.

The Mayor asked if there was anyone present who wished to speak in regards to the proposed recommendation. Kelsey Bergen, Executive Director ADC spoke in favor of the project. Councilor Phillips asked Kelsey if ADC agreed with the additional public utilities easements along City street right of ways. Kelsey replied "Yes.". The Mayor asked again if there was anyone present who wished to speak in support in regards to the proposed recommendation and there was no one. There being no one else present to speak in favor of or opposition to the proposed recommendation the Mayor declared the public hearing closed.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 23-04**

WHEREAS, the Aurora Planning Commission and the Aurora City Council have held public hearings to receive public input regarding the Preliminary Plat of Mission Critical Subdivision and the Final Plat of Mission Critical First Addition, a part of the Northwest Quarter (NW½), Section Fifteen (15), Township Ten (10) North, Range Six (6) West of the 6th P.M., Hamilton County, Nebraska.; and

WHEREAS, said plat of Mission Critical First Addition meets the requirements of the Subdivision Regulations of the City of Aurora, and the Statutes of the State of Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, the Aurora Planning Commission has recommended to the City Council approval of the Final Plat to be known as Mission Critical First Addition and has recommended that it be included within the Corporate limits, and the City Council on this date has voted for approval of this Subdivision; and has voted to include this Subdivision within the City Limits; and

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Aurora, Nebraska, that the Final Plat of Mission Critical First Addition be hereby approved, and that said addition shall be included within the Corporate limits of the City of Aurora, Nebraska, and that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to execute the approval of said plat, and cause the same to be filed as required by law.

City Attorney Luzum read Ordinance No. 1167: AN ORDINANCE TO EXTEND AND INCREASE THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF AURORA, COUNTY OF HAMILTON, STATE OF NEBRASKA, PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 17-405, R.R.S.1943, BY ANNEXING THERETO A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND CONTIGUOUS TO AND NOT EMBRACED WITHIN THE PRESENT LIMITS OF THE CITY OF AURORA, CONSISTING OF MISSION CRITICAL FIRST ADDITION, AN ADDITION TO THE CITY OF AURORA, HAMILTON COUNTY, NEBRASKA, A TRACT OF LAND COMPRISING A PART OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER (NW1/4) OF SECTION FIFTEEN (15), TOWNSHIP TEN (10) NORTH, RANGE SIX (6) WEST OF THE 6TH P.M., HAMILTON COUNTY, NEBRASKA; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND SECTIONS, TO ORDER THE ORDINANCE PUBLISHED IN BOOK, PAMPHLET, OR ELECTRONIC FORM, AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Councilor Lackore moved to approve the request from Deb Kalkwarf of Grandview Café for a special liquor license and to give permission to fence off the street east of the alley between 11th and 12th Street on "L" Street to hold an outdoor beer garden and street dance during Aurora "N" Days, For 2 days: Friday, June 23, 2023, 9:00am to 1:00am and Saturday, June 24, 2023, 9:00am to 1:00am. Councilor Phillips seconded the motion. Voting Aye: Phillips, Lohrmeyer, Lackore, Roblee, Bartling and Dunn. Nay: None. The motion carried.

Councilor Lohrmeyer moved to approve the request from request from Jim Danhauer of JoJo's Gelato & Grill for a special designated liquor license for an outdoor entertainment event at their lot at 1007 Q Street on June 3, 2023, 6:00pm-10:00pm. Councilor Dunn seconded the motion. Voting Aye: Lackore, Roblee, Bartling, Dunn, Phillips and Lohrmeyer. Nay: None. The motion carried.
